

Since 1945 millions of women, including mothers and migrants, have joined the labour force. *Migrant Women's Voices* tells the stories of migrant women working in factories and hospitals, banks, care homes, shops and universities over a period of 60 years. It is compelling insight into the lives of migrant women – and the role they have played in British society since the end of the Second World War.
