A new interpretation of the Jesuit mission to New France is here experience in Japan. In order to present revisionist perspectives Jesuit missionary activity to Amerindians based on the limited regional history of New France are re-examined. The time period used in this analysis include European, mainly Iberian and considered for revisions encompass the interpretations of foreign cultures, the basic evangelistic approach of preaching, winning converts and educating them, organising Christian communities and the non-European practice of the religion. The Christian mission in Japan has proved to be a useful tool for these purposes.
